- Overfishing




Fisheries Reform Act of 1997

- Fishery Management Plans (FMP)
 - Species, Area, and/or Gear Plans
 - End overfishing, rebuild overfished stocks, manage for an optimum yield
 - Address conflicts, bycatch, etc.
- Coastal Habitat Protection Plans
 - Enhance habitat/water quality for coastal fisheries resources

Stock Status Report

- Annual Review of Commercial and Recreational Fisheries
- Basis for selecting species for FMP development



Priority Species

 Species/Stocks designated Overfished or Concern generally take priority.

• Plans are required for all species contained in the report.

- Advisory Panel

- MFC Advisory Committee Review Finfish, Crustacean, Shellfish, Habitat and Water Quality, Regional.
- MFC Review and Approval
- Secretarial Review
- Legislative Commission Review
- Final MFC Approval

New Legislative Changes to the FRA of 1997

- Separate definitions for overfished and overfishing.
- Replace MSY/OY with Sustainable Harvest.
- Specify a rebuilding time period.
