As the year draws to a close, many of us choose to take stock of the past year's accomplishments and priorities. Here APNEP, we have been reflecting on the Partnership's major initiatives in 2017, including the <u>Albemarle-Pamlico Ecosystem Symposium</u>, our <u>Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between North Carolina and Virginia</u>, and our <u>Sound Reflections</u> interview series celebrating APNEP's 30th anniversary.

We are also looking forward to 2018 and the work we will be focusing on to continue

<u>Committee</u>, will move forward on developing ecological indicators for the Albemarle-Pamlico region. Additionally, we will continue to increase collaboration between North Carolina and Virginia, beginning with the formation of a task force to guide MOU implementation. Joint NC/VA efforts will also include inventories of water quality, fish passage, and wetlands data. Later in the year, our Submerged Aquatic Vegetation (SAV) partners have advised collecting another round of SAV survey data to further understanding of changes in SAV density and extent since <u>previous surveys</u> from 2007-2008 and 2012-2014.

We would like to thank our partners for all their time, energy, and feedback in 2017 - we hope you will join us in 2018 as we continue our work to identify, protect, and restore the natural resources of the Albemarle-Pamlico region.


### Sound Reflections with Jack Thigpen
