On June 12th, APNEP staff traveled to Lake Mattamuskeet National Wildlife Refuge to lead environmental education activities as part of the NC Cooperative Extension and Hyde County 4H's Hyde, Seek, and Discover Day Camp. Staff talked to campers about how we can take care of our waterways and explored water quality concepts through hands-on activities.
