JULY 14, 1988

Chairman Chesson called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. He welcomed those present and thanked them for their participation. He then reviewed certain recent APES meetings, those being the May 12 A-CAC meeting, the June 9 Policy Committee meeting and the A-CAC Public Awareness/Government Relations sub-committee meetings held on April 14, May 3, and June 21, and a working session held on July 6 pertaining to the proposed APES annual meeting.

In connection with the June 9 Policy Committee meeting, Chairman Chesson referred to the FY 88-89 budget which was distributed on that day. Discussion ensued with emphasis being placed on the procedure to be employed in reimbursing the CACs for travel during the course of their APES involvement. (See Attachment A.) It was decided that the draft policy be included on the agenda of the A-CAC.

In further discussion of budgetary items, the feeling that more projects should have been funded pertaining to the Albemarle region was raised. Dr. Chesson requested that Mrs. Giordano make that concern known to Dr. Bob Holman, Project Director. Mrs. Giordano agreed. It was finally determined that a position paper from the A-CAC stating their future priorities would be prepared for presentation at the APES annual meeting. Capt. Howard, Yates Barber and John Stallings agreed to draft it for further discussion at the August 8 CAC meeting.

Chairman Chesson discussed the draft version of the proposed APES annual meeting agenda (see Attachment B) and appointed three representatives to participate on a joint task force with the P-CAC. A-CAC members are Don Flowers, Joe Stutts and Carolyn Hess.

Don Flowers briefly discussed the hazards of using the herbicide Garlon 4 on the USAF Dare County Bomb Range.
