Why are Public Meetings Being Held?

The North Carolina Division of Water Quality (DWQ) has prepared a draft *Neuse River Basinwide Water Quality Plan* as a tool to help restore and protect water quality in the Neuse River basin. Public meetings are held to answer questions about the draft plan and to obtain comments on the plan. The draft plan will be revised as needed based on public comments and presented to the Environmental Management Commission for approval in July 2002.

What is the Neuse River Basinwide Water Quality Plan?

The NC Division of Water Quality (DWQ) prepares basinwide water quality plans for each of the state's 17 major river basins. The first *Neuse River Basinwide Water Quality Plan* was completed in 1993 The second was completed in 1998. DWQ updates the plans every five years, and the revised *Neuse Plan* is to be completed in 2002. The plan will provide an overview of the river basin including hydrology, land use, population, growth trends, natural resources, wastewater discharges, animal operations and water usage information.

The plan also presents general water quality information including summaries of monitoring data and use support ratings in the basin. There are goals and recommendations for improving water quality, as well as information about water quality improvement initiatives at the local level.

How Can I Get More Information or Submit Comments?

The meeting will open with a short presentation by DWQ staff on the highlights of the draft Neuse River Basinwide Water Quality Plan. [Copies of the draft plan will be available at the public meetings; however, you are encouraged to review the document prior to attending.] The presentation will be followed by a question and answer session. Time will then be available for you to make verbal comments on the plan and express ways that DWQ may be able to help you improve water quality throughout the basin. DWQ is interested in hearing your comments on the basinwide plan. We encourage you to submit written comments to the address below:
