### **North Carolina Coastal Federation** 2011 Jockey's Ridge State Park Community-based Shoreline Restoration Contract No. 4437

# Final Report To Albemarle-Pamlico National Estuary Program **September 10, 2012**

#### Summary

The Roanoke Sound estuary is a rich, brackish-water coastal estuarine ecosystem. Fringing coastal marshes containing giant cordgrass (Spartina cynoseroides), smooth cordgrass (S. alterniflora), black needlerush (Juncus roemarianus) and salt meadow hay (S. patens) and provide essential habitats for many fish and waterfowl. Within Jockey's Ridge State Park, this marsh system is healthy along approximately forty percent of the park's one mile estuarine shoreline, but is experiencing significant erosion elsewhere. The marsh protects the adjacent riparian barrier island trees, shrubs and grasses classified as of regional and state significance and harbors rare species of plants and animals. Fringe marsh also provides vital spawning, nursery, and feeding areas for most of the region's important coastal fishery species.

Protecting and replanting the marsh along the northern section of the park has been the focus of restoration activities in recent years. Before restoration this area suffered severe shoreline erosion due to wind and wave-generated forces as well as damage from vehicular and pedestrian traffic. Grants awarded to the North Carolina Coastal Federation in FY 08 and 09 from the SARP program and a USFWS grand program have led to the highly successful implementation of two shoreline restoration projects.

Phase I and II of the restoration restored or protected approximately 1.5 acres of coastal marsh along 725' of the park's shoreline with an off-shore bagged oyster shell sill. In July 2011, the restored marsh appeared health and the oyster sill was effectively dissipating wave energy at the site. Blue crabs and juvenile fish were observed in the newly created marsh and waters behind the sill and there was an increase in the number of wading birds observed foraging in the marsh. In late August 2011, Hurricane Irene passed over Dare County, bringing heavy rainfall, strong wave energy, and, most damagingly, a large storm surge, which uprooted some of the most recently restored marsh areas. This current phase of the project aims to replant marsh grasses and riparian vegetation in the restore areas and add an additional layer of oyster shell bags to the sill enhancing the shellfish and finfish habitat on site. Given the initial project success, the federation and the park are motivated to continue cultivating the coastal marsh in this restored area and bring the project site to its fullest restoration potential.

#### **Project Benefits**

This project is part of a multi-year effort for the federation and Park, It implements a living shoreline restoration project that restores lost and degraded marsh along the park's shoreline. protects it with an oyster sill, thereby creating essential fish habitat and involves the local community in its implementation to foster a better understanding of the unique ecosystems that the park and Outer Banks support and cultivates a new generation of environmental and coastal stewards.

#### Objectives/Progress: July 1, 2012- September 15, 2012

The Jockey's Ridge State Park Community-based Shoreline Restoration in Nags Head, NC project goal is to restore and maintain a living shoreline, which consists of a bagged oyster shell sill and marsh grass plantings along 725' of the parks shoreline by engaging community volunteers and student groups in the restoration effort. The project is complete but monitoring efforts will continue for the next two years as part of the permit requirements.

The following work was completed to meet the project goals and objectives during this reporting period:

- The federation staff led a site visit for the North Carolina Aquarium on Roanoke Island's Aquatic Adventure Camp. The students toured the site and drew pictures of the shoreline demonstrating their learning and understanding of this important estuarine habitat.
- The federation staff led 6 interpretive programs at the NC Aquarium's Jennette's Pier in July and August. This program was open to the public and focused on the importance of estuaries and their habitats. The restoration project at Jockey's Ridge was featured. Over 200 residents and Outer Banks visitors were educated as part of the program.
- The federation and park staff led a day of restoration at the Park on July 9, 2012. Students from the River City Community Development Corporation Youth Build Program, based out of Elizabeth City, assisted with shell bag placement. They returned again on September 6, 2012 for the final day of sill maintenance and project restoration efforts.-Liability on file with the federation.
- A troop of 13 girl scouts and 5 adults from Plymouth assisted with shell bag placement on July 21, 2012.-Liability on file with the federation.
- The federation staff led a vegetation monitoring session with ten student's participating in the NOAA Monitor National Marine Sanctuary Youth Working Group Program. The students monitored the vegetation growth in the Phase I project area on August 9th. Ten students and four adults from Chesapeake, Virginia assisted with the monitoring effort.-Liability on file with NOAA.
- The federation staff monitored the vegetation in Phase II of the project area on August 29, 2012.
- The federation staff created a plaque and new signs for the project site. These will be used to promote the project, partners and funders in various outreach/educational venues. Pdf of sign available here:

# YouthBuild students participate in Outer Banks shoreline projects

River City YouthBuild students recently participated in two community service projects on the Outer Banks where they assisted the North Carolina Coastal Federation with two Living Shoreline Projects.

Living Shorelines are alternatives to bulkheads that protect shorelines while creating needed habitat for coastal fish and plant species.

They involve creating a lowprofile off-shore sill, often made of either oyster shell bags or granite, which protects the shoreline, and are then planted with native marsh grass to further protect the shoreline and create needed habitat.

The federation has implemented more than 20 living shoreline projects in the state.

In early May, students trav-

eled from Elizabeth City to assist with a project in Hatteras. In a single afternoon, they planted nearly 3,000 marsh grasses at a site on Durant's Point. This project was designed to restore marsh that had eroded and protect Hatteras Harbor, which is very important to the local culture and economy.

On a second visit to the Outer Banks in July, the students helped create an off-shore sill made of oyster shell bags. This sill protects the shoreline and newly restored marsh at Jockey's Ridge State Park.

Historic damage to the sand dunes had allowed sand to blow directly on the fringing salt marsh, making it susceptible to wave and wind erosion. The oyster sill and marsh grass plantings are designed to restore the lost marsh and protect the shoreline

from future erosion.

These environmental projects increased YouthBuild students' awareness of how fragile North Carolina's coast is as well as man's responsibility to protect it. River City Community Development Corporation, in partnership with the North Carolina Coastal Federation, plans to sponsor future opportunities for community service for YouthBuild students creating an invaluable hands-on experience for participants.
